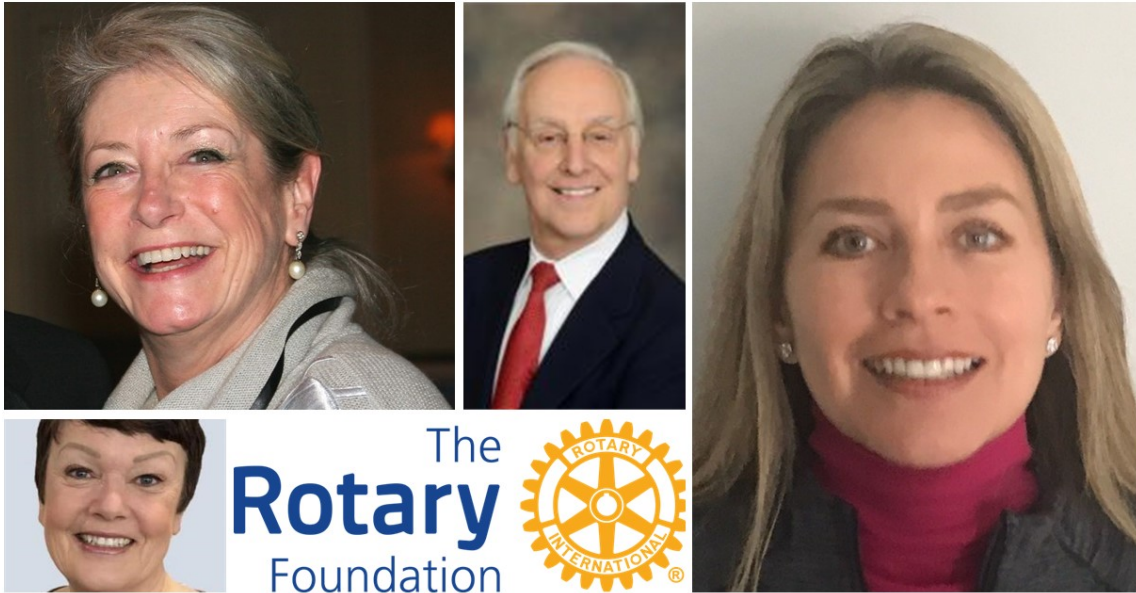
## **Imagine the Power of Education and Literacy**

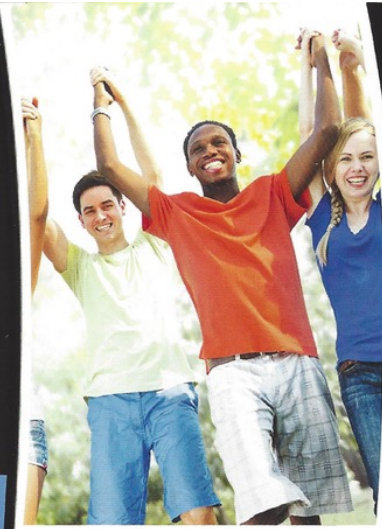

*The Youth Exchange Scholarships are made possible by the generosity of our overseas partners and local Rotary clubs in Rotary District 6900 (Greater Atlanta and west Georgia). Qualified applicants must be ages 15-18 ½ at the time of departure. The scholarships cover room, board, tuition, and a monthly stipend for one academic year. The student/family pays for the airfare, insurance, and some other fees.*

## Rotary Youth Exchange Applications Now Open for 2023-24 Rotary Youth Exchange Scholarships

Applications for the District 6900 Rotary Youth Exchange scholarships for the 2023 - 2024 school year are open now. Each scholarship is valued at \$24,000 and gives Georgia high school students an opportunity to study abroad. Rotary clubs can award the scholarships at no cost to the club.

Before applying for the scholarships, Georgia high school students and their parents must attend an Informational Session. Those sessions are being held in the greater Atlanta area in August and September. The application deadline is October 14, 2022. See details in the full story.

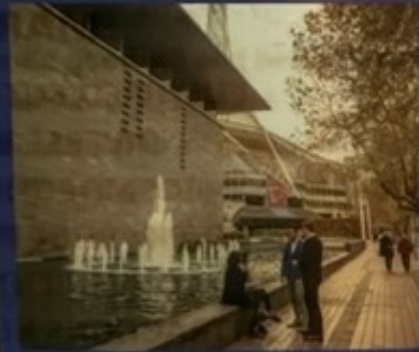

**Pine Mountain Middle School Memorial Garden Refreshed**

The North Cobb Rotary Club TEAMED UP with the Kennesaw Mountain Varsity Volleyball team to clean and freshen the Pine Mountain Middle School Memorial Garden, Kennesaw. The Pine Mountain Memorial Garden was rededicated during the 2004-2005 school year to honor Jack Hensley, a Pine Mountain Middle School widely admired substitute teacher and parent. Mr. Hensley was one of three hostages kidnapped and killed while working in Iraq in the fall of 2004, garnering national and world-wide attention. Since then, many other beloved individuals of Pine Mountain Middle School have been memorialized in the garden. [more]
